Frequently Asked Questions

WHAT SHOULD I BRING TO CAMP?

Sleeping bags and pillows are optional. We can provide linens, pillows, and blankets for an additional charge. Please remember to pack for cold weather. A packing list for school trips is available on our website.

Please note that **cell phones do not work at Frost Valley**. You may bring a calling card or purchase one from our store.

WHAT PAPERWORK MUST TEACHERS BRING TO FROST VALLEY?

- Student and teacher/chaperone attendance list
- Lodge assignment list
- Bus assignment list
- Frost Valley waiver and medical forms we will collect these upon arrival along with any medications that your students may bring. Please make copies of these and note that a doctor's signature must be on the medical forms. This allows the Frost Valley nursing staff to administer medications. Without a doctor's signature, New York state law does not allow us to give out any medications, including OTC's. For further information, please call us at (845) 985-2291 ext. 225.

WHAT IS THE CERTIFICATE OF INSURANCE?

This document is mandatory. It should list Frost Valley as additionally insured. You can ask your business office for this, or if you are from a NYC public school, contact Arlene Longoria Carragher at the NYC Department of Education, Legal Services.

FOR STUDENTS WITH SPECIAL NEEDS OF ANY KIND (DIETARY, MEDICAL, OR DEVELOPMENTAL) WHAT DO I NEED TO KNOW?

We welcome all students regardless of ability or special needs. Our staff is well-equipped to accommodate nearly all developmental, physical, medical, or dietary needs. Please call your program coordinator to discuss.

WHAT IS THE LODGING LIKE?

We offer several different styles of lodging. All have indoor bathrooms, electricity, hot water and heat. Your contract will list your assigned lodges based on your request and availability. Check our website for photographs and descriptions.

WHAT IS THE WEATHER LIKE AT FROST VALLEY?

It's typically 10 degrees colder than the surrounding areas and usually with more snow. Pack accordingly. Please check the weather forecast for Claryville, NY, a day or two before the trip.

WHAT IF STUDENTS GET SICK OR INJURED?

If you are not bringing your own nurse, we recommend you use our nursing services. The Guenther Family Wellness Center, on campus, is a state-of-the-art healthcare facility, staffed 24 hours a day. Our healthcare team will assess any sick or injured child or adult. If a child needs to go home or to the hospital, you will be notified immediately and arrangements will be made with the student's parents.

WHAT HAPPENS ON ARRIVAL AND DEPARTURE DAYS?

ARRIVAL: Upon arrival, check in at the Welcome Center, the first building on the right as you enter camp. You will meet your program coordinator there and receive further instructions about busses and luggage. All adults on the trip will need to present their photo ID to check in. This will be done upon arrival or at the first lunch. Typically, orientation will be in the Dining Hall at 11:30am. Lunch and a teacher/chaperone meeting will follow at noon. After lunch, you will have some free time before class starts at 1:15pm.

DEPARTURE: Before breakfast, students will be expected to tidy their lodges, pack, and group their luggage for our luggage crew. Brooms and dust pans are provided. Facilitators will instruct you where to leave your luggage. We ask that students and adults do not go back into the lodges once classes begin, as our housekeeping crew will be preparing for our next guests to arrive. After packing, head to breakfast which begins at 8:00 am. Morning class will follow, then lunch. Departure time is approximately 1:00 pm.

AS THE LEAD TEACHER, WHAT IS MY ROLE AND WHAT DO I NEED TO KNOW?

Your program coordinator will help you design a program based on your goals for the trip. Take a look at our website for ideas. Please let your coordinator know about any activities, topics, and goals you would like to have incorporated into the trip. Your role is to help promote a positive learning environment, and we encourage you to participate and empower your students.

During class time, we require two adults (one Frost Valley instructor and one teacher/chaperone). For overnight supervision, we recommend a ratio of one adult to eight students at the 6th grade level or below, and a ratio of one adult to ten students above the 6th grade level.

What's New and Upcoming at Frost Valley

We are constantly reviewing ways we can better serve your students and school. This often involves adding new programs or class facilities as well as adapting the content or delivery of some of our current offerings. Here are a few of our newer programs we think your students will really enjoy and will really benefit from. If there is a lesson or theme you're covering at school you'd like us to reinforce or give first-hand experience at Frost Valley please speak with your program coordinator. We may be able to put something specific together for your trip.

ENERGY OUEST

This is a great new addition to our curriculum and will fit wonderfully into your conservation, energy awareness, environmental awareness or physics curricula. We've made this lesson very hands on and thought provoking with demos and activities which will allow students to explore where energy comes from, how we use it and the importance of conservation. As they touch on energy conservation they will see some of the practices Frost Valley has put in place to use less energy. They will have the opportunity to power many typical household items with energy they create as they pedal our energy bicycle.

SERVICE LEARNING

Many studies have shown that some of the most powerful educational experiences come through service. Furthermore, many schools are now requiring volunteer or service hours of their students. One of the fastest growing and meaningful offerings at Frost Valley YMCA provides the opportunity for your students to get down and dirty with service projects while learning the benefits and importance of giving time and energy to others. In a 2 or 4 hour block your students will certainly be helping out Frost Valley but, more importantly, they will be gaining a sense of pride and learning the value of service. Over the past several years students have helped us build bridges over streams, build a greenhouse constructed of water bottles, worked restoring and shoring up our trails and removed invasive species. Or if you have some other creative ideas of service projects your students can perform at Frost Valley, we're all ears.

HEALTHY COOKING KITCHEN

Brand new in summer 2014, Frost Valley has a teaching kitchen where students can team up in small groups to learn to cook simple and healthy foods. Combine this with a trip to our Greenhouse and Garden areas for a farm-to-table experience. Students will learn some cooking skills and philosophies which they can hopefully take home with them. Our instructors will also be discussing plant life cycles, nutrition and may touch upon food systems.

HALF DAY OR ALL DAY HIKE

While this has always been on our list of class choices, many schools don't realize that they can add specific curriculum to the hike. We can easily make sure to cover specific geology and ecology topics, visit our resource management center or even cover some outdoor living skills while out on trail. It sounds grueling but it actually allows our Instructors to set an easier pace and to see more sites in our outdoor classroom they aren't able to reach in a single period. Turn this into an All Day Hike and we can either pack a lunch to bring with us or do some simple trail cooking over a fire.

MEDICAL SERVICES:

Our Health Center provides 24-hour emergency care for schools and groups while at Frost Valley YMCA. Our staff consists of trained professionals dedicated to providing quality health care, including medication administration and emergency medical service. Our medical staff are experienced in wilderness extraction with emergency extraction equipment. Our resident nursing staff provides unique services to students with special needs with advanced notification. We carry backboards, oxygen therapy, nebulizer machines, biohazard kits, first aid supplies, Automatic Electronic Defibrillators (AED), splints, and rapid response vehicles such as our ATV with rescue trailer. The Frost Valley YMCA nursing services are charged toward each calendar day for your stay, (i.e. a Monday-Wednesday trip is charged for three days).
