### Packing List

#### Clothing

*Laundry is not provided*

- 1 Synthetic long underwear top
- 1 Synthetic long underwear bottom
- 2 Heavyweight non-cotton top (fleece)
- 2 Non-cotton work pants
- 1 Long sleeve cotton/poly blend shirt
- 4-6 Work t-shirts (non-cotton preferred)\*
- 4-6 Work shorts
- Waterproof rain jacket (no ponchos)
- Waterproof rain pants
- Loose-fitting underwear
- 3-5 Socks
- 4-6 Pair wool or polypro socks
- Hat with good sun-protection
- Winter hat
- Swim suit & towel
- Pair of work boots or sturdy hiking boots\*
- Pair of comfortable sneakers or shoes\*
- Pair of water shoes\* (old sneakers or sport sandals with covered toe and ankle strap are fine)

#### Essential Items

- Day Pack (school backpack size)
- Sleeping bag & stuff sack (30 degree or lower – must pack small)\*\*
- Sleeping pad (must pack small)\*\*
- Mug, bowl, and spoon
- Headlamp with extra batteries
- 2 Nalgene (or similar) water bottles (32 oz.)
- Toothbrush and travel-sized toothpaste
- Showering items (shampoo, soap, towel etc...)
- SUNSCREEN (30 SPF min.)
- Work gloves

#### Preferred Items

- Small insect repellent
- Sunglasses with retaining cord
- Bandana
- Small pack towel

#### Convenience Items

- Lip balm
- Comb or brush
- Journal and pencil
- Book, cards, etc.
- Waterproof camera

\*SOME CLOTHING SHOULD BE EXPENDABLE – THEY MAY BECOME MARRED WHILE WORKING

\*PLEASE BREAK SHOES IN BEFORE CAMP TO PREVENT BLISTERS

\*\*ITEMS CAN BE BORROWED FROM FROST VALLEY UPON REQUEST

Personal electronics such as an iPod are acceptable during transportation to and from trip sites. Electronic devices may be used on the trip at other points in time at the Trip Leaders' discretion. Please note, there are few – if any – places to charge electronics devices, and all electronics are up to the camper to keep safe.

Proper clothing and equipment are essential to prevent safety issues such as sprained ankles, sunburn, hypothermia, and blisters. Campers must have the essential gear listed in order to safely participate on the trip.
